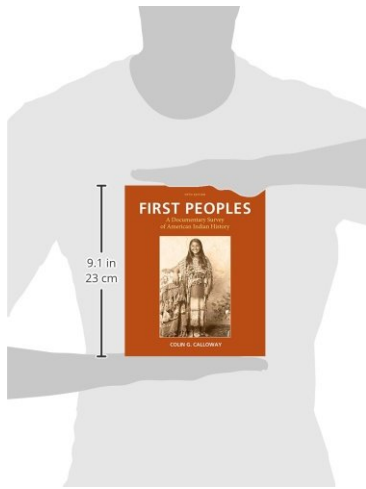

First Peoples: A Documentary Survey of American Indian History (4th ed.). Boston, MA: Mary Dougherty. President Andrew Jackson signed the Indian Removal Act on 28 May 1830. The act permitted the President to provide Native American tribes such as the Creeks, Cherokees, Chickasaws, Choctaws, and Seminoles with unsettled lands located west of the Mississippi River in exchange for their lands within existing state borders.
