XML is the abbreviation for Extensible Markup Language and is an established data exchange format. XML was defined 1998 by the World Wide Web Consortium (W3C). An XML document consists of elements, each element has a start tag, content and an end tag. An XML document must have exactly one root element (i.e., one tag which encloses the remaining tags). XML differentiates between capital and non-capital letters. An XML file must be well-formed. This means that it must apply to the following conditions: An XML document always starts with a prolog (see below for an explanation of what a prolog is)
