Fittingly, a book I'd ordered from Amazon just arrived in the mail: The Art of Osamu Tezuka: God of Manga by Helen McCarthy. The book is deeply discounted on Amazon right now - only \$16.59 - and includes a dvd with a rare 1985 Japanese documentary about the artist. It's a classy looking package and the most comprehensive overview of Tezuka's life I've seen in English. The book doesn't appear to focus as much on his animation work as I would have liked, but that's understandable given Osamu Tezuka has often been called the Walt Disney of Japan, but he was far more than that. In 1944, was sent to Ichiryama Health Training Center for teenagers who were weaker than average to toughen up before getting sent to war.
