First steps towards the development of "quality of working life" concepts and measures. can be traced back to the late 1960s and 1970s. Their origins are linked to the research. The nature of employment and quality of work. were immediately included in the research agenda, focussing on non-pecuniary aspects. of jobs and individuals' experiences of their working environments (Seashore, 1974)

Full employment is a situation in which there is no cyclical or deficient-demand unemployment. Full employment does not entail the disappearance of all unemployment, as other kinds of unemployment, namely structural and frictional, may remain. For instance, workers who are "between jobs" for short periods of time as they search for better employment are not counted against full employment, as such unemployment is frictional rather than cyclical. An economy with full employment might also have
