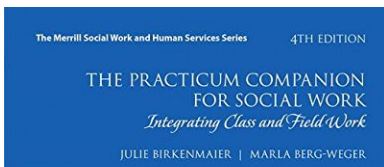

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Field experience enables social work students to practice skills learned in their coursework and observe professionals at work. Social work field placements give students a leg up in their profession, providing them with practical work experience and practice dealing with challenges and issues they are likely to face on the job. Social work interns also give back to their communities while they hone their skills. During a social work practicum, the student follows and observes a social worker on a limited basis, usually once a week. The student may take on some responsibilities under the close supervision of a trained social worker. A practicum is generally part of a course that requires reporting and reflecting on experiences in the field to combine theory and practice. Practicum (Field Work I, II, & III). Social Service Worker Program students complete practicum placements in community agencies. The program faculty organize the placements after consultation with each student. The weekly placement (4 to 5 hours per week) lasts throughout the school year. After final exams in the Spring term, students begin their five-week full-time block placement in a different agency. Students are expected to learn about the agency, its operations, the community in which it operates, the challenges experienced by the consumers of the services and the methods of helping.
